For contest information and registration forms, visit MWRA School Programs at www.mwra.com. The deadline for entries is March 12, 2010.


Following the MWRA Poster contest, all Boston student posters will be forwarded to BWSC for the "2nd Chance Poster Contest." BWSC will judge these posters and select winners from every participating school. A certificate will be awarded to every Boston school student who enters the Poster Contest.

Winning posters from the "2nd Chance Poster Contest" will be displayed at the Boston Water and Sewer Commission headquarters, 980 Harrison Avenue, Boston, MA 02119 during **National Drinking Water Week - May 2 - 8, 2010**. Winning posters will also be available for viewing on the BWSC website www.bwsc.org under Educational Resources.

Contest Guidelines

Create a poster showing someone (or a group of people) doing their job in the water or wastewater field.

Posters will be judged in three grade level categories: K to 2nd, 3rd to 5th and 6th to 8th.



POSTER CONTEST
Create a poster showing someone (or a group of people) doing their job in the water or wastewater field. Posters will be judged in three grade levels categories: K-2, 3-5, and 6-8.

WRITING CONTEST
GRADES 3-5: You are one of the many people whose job it is to provide safe, clean drinking water or process wastewater. Write about a "typical" day on the job.
GRADES 6-8: You recently started a new job in the water and/or wastewater field. Write about how your job has a positive impact on the environment and the people in your community.
GRADES 9-12: Not many high school students consider a career in the water and/or wastewater field. Write an essay to convince young people that this is a great field to consider.

CONTEST INFORMATION
All entries must be postmarked by Friday, March 12th. Early entries are encouraged!
The first place winner in each category receives a \$100.00 gift card, 2nd place a \$50.00 gift card and 3rd place a \$25.00 gift card. Every student who enters will receive a certificate of participation. All winners, along with their families and teachers are invited to an Award Ceremony on Friday, May 27, 2010 at Deer Island.
The poster/writing contest is open to all schools located in the MWRA Service Area.
